Twenty-eight students from Madelia High School near Minneapolis will visit Oshkosh as part of a community service road trip called the Pay It Forward (PIF) Tour. The tour allows students the opportunity to serve, lead and learn. In just five days, these students will travel to and serve in four different communities, with Oshkosh as their second stop.

The students will work with the Tower View Villa and spend time with the residents as well as help out with some outdoor facility maintenance.

"I am excited the students are able to serve with this organization," said Cody Nelson, Manager of High School Programs with Students Today Leaders Forever, "but I'm also looking forward to the excitement for service that the students will bring back to their home communities."

The PIF Tour is organized and planned by college students who are part of Students Today Leaders Forever (STLF). The tour is a great opportunity for high school students and college students to interact, building positive relationships.

The tour's final stop is Chicago, where seven buses of students from various high schools will serve together. Each bus takes a unique route to Chicago, so collectively the students will serve over 5100 hours in 21 communities.
